



What's your potential for bird problems?

While some birds are not a nuisance, there are quite a few that are. Pigeons, sparrows, geese, starlings, and several other bird species can negatively impact your business. Use our checklist to help gauge your risk for potential bird problems, and see if there are any factors that may be directly contributing to an increase of bird activity on your property.

Do you see birds roosting or perching on:

- □ your building?
- □ neighboring buildings?
- □ inside your building?
- □ in trees or shrubbery near your building?

Do you see droppings on/in/near:

- □ awnings?
- □ sidewalks or entrance ways?
- \Box windows or balconies?
- parked cars?
- □ HVAC units?
- □ gutters and rooftops?
- Iedges, pipes or overhead beams?
- □ loading dock overhangs?

Do you receive complaints about:

- Ioud bird noises?
- □ bird droppings?
- □ birds stealing food?
- □ being "attacked" by birds?

Do you have nesting areas?

- □ Have you seen nests on your building?
- □ Are birds nesting in or behind signage?
- □ Are birds seen flying into vents or gaps in siding?

Do you have food sources?

- □ Is there food spillage near your building from deliveries?
- □ Are dumpsters uncovered or regularly left open?
- □ Are trash receptacles stored near the building?
- Do you have outside dining areas?
- Do you have tenants or visitors feeding birds?
- Do you have bird feeders on the property?

How many boxes did you check?

Whether you checked one, or all twenty-five boxes, there are risks and liabilities associated with pest birds that can lead to shutdowns and lost revenue.
